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History

- Caltrans proposed to build Caldecott Tunnel's New Fourth Bore without mitigations for noise, traffic, loss of sleep, inconvenience, loss of vegetation to the nearby residents
- Fourth Bore coalition sued and won \$8.2 million for Oakland for mitigations to affected area.
- Money is designated only for cyclists and pedestrian use
- Emphasis on areas directly affected by construction.

Process

- Elaborate public meeting and comments by the City of Oakland.
- Oakland created a priority list with the Parkwoods and North Hills with the highest priority because those people who:
 - Lost many nights of sleep
 - Lost a forest planted by tunnel
 - Inconvenience of living at ground zero for many years.

Dear Fourth Bore Coalition representatives,

I am pleased to announce that the City of Oakland has finalized its review of the three bids received for Caldecott projects #1-4.

As you know, because of the delay since the cost estimates for the projects were first developed, it was anticipated that the remaining Caldecott funds would not be sufficient to pay for all components of these projects. In light of this, city staff submitted the project for inclusion in the city's Capital Improvement Program (CIP). The projects did not score high enough to be included in the city's 2019-21 CIP budget, according to the City Council-approved prioritization process. Therefore the city requested separate bids for a "Base bid" and five "Bid Alternates," as follows:

- Base bid: Improvements to Tunnel/SR 13/Hiller intersection, including:
 - Sidewalk from Berkeley to existing Hiller Drive sidewalk
 - Shared use path/ramp on south side of Tunnel Road
 - New pedestrian and bike intersection crossings, including new signals
 - Retaining wall
 - Grading
- Alt. #1: Sidewalk along north side of Tunnel Road between Hiller Drive and a few hundred feet west of where Tunnel Road makes a 90-degree turn. (This sidewalk segment requires no retaining walls.)
- Alt #2: Bike lane striping between Tunnel Road/Hiller Drive and the end of Caldecott Lane at the Parkwoods Apts.
- Alt #3: Sidewalk between Bid Alt #1 and where Tunnel Road makes the 90-degree turn.
- Alt #4: Sidewalk between Bid Alt #3 and the end of Caldecott Lane
- Alt #5: Micro-surfacing of the entire project area (between a slurry seal and a complete repaving)

According to the bids received the remaining Caldecott funds will cover the base bid and Alt #2. Therefore staff will ask the City Council to award a contract to make the bulleted pedestrian and bicycle improvements to the Tunnel/SR 13/Hiller intersection, as well as stripe bike lanes between that intersection and the end of Caldecott Lane. Because of the City Council summer recess and cancellation of all Committee meetings in July by the Council President, the contract will be presented to the Public Works Committee in September and to City Council thereafter.
