


NHCA Treasurer's Report Fiscal Year 2022

NHCA's Financial Operations Overview

The North Hills Community Association:

- Is a registered §501(c)(3) non-profit organization.
- Relies entirely on individual and business donations to fund its operations.
- Uses a cash accounting method.
- Has no paid staff and owns no depreciable assets or real property.
- Maintains separate checking and savings accounts.
- Accepts cash donations via check or online and in-kind donations.

 Prioritization and budgeting of wildfire prevention in the strategic planning of the Oakland Fire Department

Advocacy

- 2022 efforts focused on increasing influence with:
 - City leaders
 - Elected officials
- Building alliances and synergy with other local, public safety-related groups
 - Claremont Canyon Conservancy
 - The Oakland Firesafe Council
- Monitoring city government planning in light of our area's specific concerns
 - General Plan
 - Mid-year budget cycle
 - Redistricting

Advocacy cont'd

NHCA also hosted several events:

- July 27th bench installation and ceremony for OPD Officer John William Grubensky at the Firestorm Memorial Garden
- National Night Out featured on KTVU
- Co-hosted a councilmember and school district board candidate forums with the League of Women Voters

Public Safety Chair

Explanation of the Board Composition & Voting

- A candidate for the NHCA Board of Directors must be a member of the NHCA, i.e. a resident of the Oakland Police Department Beat 13Y.
- The size of the NHCA Board of Directors may fluctuate from a minimum of four (4) members up to a maximum of twelve (12).
- The NHCA Board of Directors members shall hold office for one year.

Explanation of the Board Composition & Voting cont'd

- Nominations may be made from the floor at a membership meeting provided that the person nominating a candidate for the Board of Directors from the floor present a petition signed by at least 10 NHCA members in support of the nomination.
- The election of Board of Directors members shall be by a majority vote of the attending general membership at the March NHCA membership meeting.
- In accordance with Oakland City Council Resolution #79235, the March NHCA membership meeting shall also elect by a majority vote a Board of Directors member to serve as 2nd Vice Chair / Chair of the Public Safety Committee.
