Call to order: Dan Conolly called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm

Presentation: Helene Cahen and Arthur Guimardes are Safer Highlands Board members; they had asked for, and received permission, to address the NHCA Board. They presented a petition, which requests that the City of Oakland supply additional police services to Beat 13Y. Their goal is to collect 500 signatures from residents of Beat Y13. After their presentation they left the meeting.

Adoption of Agenda: The agenda was reviewed and approved.

- **1. Review and Approval of Minutes:** Carolyn Burgess moved to approve the Minutes of May 15, 2023. Vicki Oliveira seconded. Motion carried 6-0.
- 2. Treasurer's Report: None
- 3. Committee Reports

A. Garden and Events: Vicki Oliveira

1. Gardening with the Goats: Vicki reported that she had met with Martin Matarese, former supervisor of wildland management for the City of Oakland, now with Ecosystems Concepts, a goat grazing company. Martin confirmed that the

goats would be at the Gateway Garden and Pavillion on Tuesday, June 20, 2023 from 4-6 p.m. for a festive neighborhood gathering. Vicki and Dan will organize popcorn, lemonade and do the set up. Carolyn volunteered to help.

- **2. 2**nd **Annual Ice Cream Social, Plant Sale Fundraiser**: Vicki is organizing an Ice Cream Social, with ice cream donated from Dreyer's, on August 19th. NHCA may have a raffle at the event.
- **3. BrightView manual Weed Abatement and Landscape Maintenance of Gateway Gardens.** On June 5, 2023, BrightView submitted proposal #8124652 for landscape maintenance and disposal of green waste for Gateway Garden. The proposed price is \$1,437.23.
- **4. BrightView manual Weed Abatement and Landscape Maintenance of Firestorm Memorial Garden.** On June 5, 2023, BrightView submitted proposal #8124632 for landscape maintenance and disposal of green waste for the Firestorm Memorial Garden. The proposed price is \$1,122.53.

The two proposals total \$2,559.76. Carolyn moved to accept BrightView's proposals. Nancy seconded. Motion carried 6-0.

B. Communications: Donna Karch and David Kessler Donna Karch reported that she and David Kessler went through each link on the NHCA website and found some issues that need to be addressed. Donna has sent a list of items to the web master.

C. Membership: Katie Kochounian

Katie is on vacation, thus there was no committee report. The Board discussed welcoming gifts for new residents of NHCA.

D. Advocacy: Shivani Grover, Committee Chair, has resigned from the NHCA Board.

The Board discussed the second round of the postcards. They will be mailed too late to include details about National Night Out (NNO). David Kessler suggested posting an invitation on NHCA Announcements inviting people to sit out in their front yard and gather neighbors together.

David proposed the following letter:

Dear Neighbors:

I know people whose lives were saved because, on the morning of October 20, 1991, neighbors knocked on their door to warn them of the approaching fire. I know people who perished because no neighbor knocked. Neighbors are our first line of defense in emergencies. Literally, a matter of life and death.

But how many of us know the people in the homes down the street? How many small children, disabled adults, or vulnerable pets live in each home? Virtually every street in the North Hills has homes that have turned over recently. Do you know your new neighbors? Do you know who might need help? Do they know what help you might need?

National Night Out is an opportunity to meet the folks living nearby. The North Hills Community Association is looking for residents who will host a National Night Out gathering on Tuesday, August 1st. We hope to find neighbors who will put some chairs out on the driveway, invite people on their street to come by, share some snacks, chat, and get to know each other. We want every street in our hills to have an event on National Night out! Won't you be the one to step forward? A fun evening, and a vital step toward building community safety.
